About Christian Marclay

Visual artist, musician and composer Christian Marclay explores an improbable common space that brings together the visual arts and music. He combines a range of media such as sound, album covers, tapes and film clips. He became a pioneer in these art forms in the 1970s when he used vinyl decks to create sound collages.

Born in 1955 in California and of Swiss origin, he trained in Geneva at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts and in Boston at the Massachusetts College of Art (MassArt). He currently lives and works in New York and London. His work has been exhibited at the Centre Pompidou (2000, 2002-2003) and the Cité de la musique (2007) in Paris, the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (2001), the Seattle Museum, the Tate Modern in London (2004 and 2018), the Palais de Tokyo (2004) and the Modern museet in Stockholm (2006). In 2011, he received the Golden Lion at the Venice Biennale for The Clock (2010), a 24-hour film to be experienced in real time, in which thousands of film sequences were sampled.
